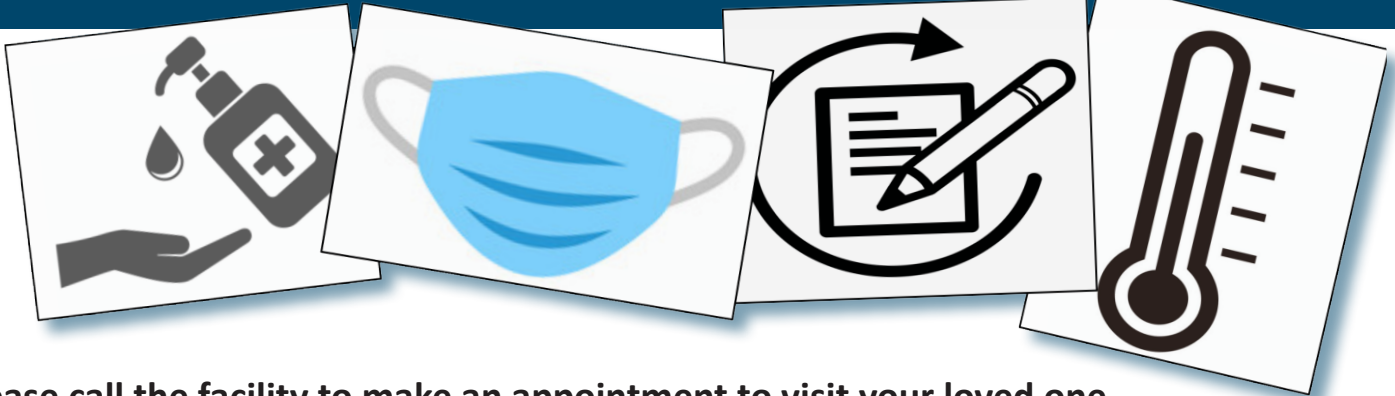


COVID-19 VISITOR HYGIENE GUIDANCE

As Per the NY State Department of Health
and Centers for Disease Control

Updated 2/24/2021



Please call the facility to make an appointment to visit your loved one.

Regulations limit the number of visitors that can be at the facility at any given time.

Beginning February 26, 2021, nursing homes may expand visitation and/or activities under the DOH's revised guidance if there has been no new onset of COVID-19 cases at the facility in the last 14 days. Note, Current COVID-19 positive residents, residents with COVID-19 signs or symptoms, and residents in a 14-day quarantine or observation period remain ineligible for in-person visits

Visitors will be screened for signs and symptoms of COVID-19 prior to resident access and visitation will be refused if the individual(s) exhibits any COVID-19 symptoms or does not pass the screening questions.

Protect Yourself and Your Loved Ones From COVID-19

- Wash your hands thoroughly with soap and water for at least 20 seconds or use Alcohol Based Hand Sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol. Hand sanitizer will be used before and after the visit and as needed.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick and stay home if you are sick.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Remember to maintain social distancing precautions of at least 6 feet from your loved one and all other residents.
- You must wear a face mask or face covering over your nose and mouth at all times while on the premises (inside or outside). Residents must also wear a facemask over their nose and mouth when visiting with loved ones. If you do not have a facemask, we will provide you with one.
- Eating or drinking during your visit is not permitted, as masks must be worn at all times.
- Movement throughout the facility is prohibited. Visits will take place in designated areas, as directed.
- If any visitor fails to adhere to the protocol, he/she/they will be prohibited from visiting for the duration of the COVID-19 state declared public health emergency.
